# Class Concept

Positions in this class serve as supervisor to the field officer to ensure compliance with conservation regulations and protect the state's fisheries resources. It is the responsibility of the Marine Patrol Supervisor to ensure the field officer is properly carrying out the Marine Fisheries rules and regulations for the assigned area and level of activity. In addition to the supervisory activities of assigning and reviewing the work of assigned staff, this classification also performs all the activities of a Marine Fisheries Law Enforcement Officer when necessary and performs all other related work. Positions in this classification generally carry the rank of Sergeant.

#### **Recruitment Standards**

# Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Thorough knowledge of Marine Fisheries enforcement policies and guidelines, state and federal laws that pertain to Marine Fisheries enforcement, North Carolina General Statutes and Fisheries Rules for Coastal Waters, and Marine Fisheries proclamations.
- Thorough knowledge of Division of Criminal Information rules, policies, and procedures; National Marine Fisheries regulations; and Marine Fisheries rules and regulations.
- Thorough knowledge of navigational charts and county/state maps.
- Skilled in operation of a patrol vessel.
- Ability to supervise and manage staff performance.

### Minimum Education and Experience

Bachelor's degree in a related field from an appropriately accredited institution, and three years of progressive law enforcement experience; or equivalent combination of training and experience.

### **Necessary Special Qualifications**

Basic Law Enforcement Certification under North Carolina Criminal Justice Training and Standards Commission. Must possess or be able to obtain and maintain a valid driver's license.
