Randall Keen serves the state as the administrative operations manager for the North Carolina Education Lottery. Keen began his career with the state in 2009, serving first as a Lottery sales representative before becoming manager of administrative operations. As the manager, Keen oversees core administrative functions of the Lottery, including motor fleet management, risk management, purchasing and more.

Both in his professional and personal life, Keen has dedicated himself to serving his community. He is an active volunteer for the American Red Cross and has organized several blood drives throughout his tenure with the state. He also participated in numerous local civic clubs, including the Raleigh Jaycees and the Raleigh Kiwanis Club. For his work with the Kiwanis, he has played key roles in some of the organization's most impactful fundraising events.

In 2018, Keen was diagnosed with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS). Keen did not allow his ALS to hinder his desire to better his community. Shortly after his diagnosis, Keen rallied his friends and family to help him raise money for a cure for the disease. So far, he has helped raise over \$80,000 for ALS research. He and his team, Randall's Ralliers, participate in the Triangle Walk to Defeat ALS each year.

Described by his colleagues as being courageous and having volunteerism in his blood, Keen's dedication to both his work and his charitable causes have undoubtedly benefited North Carolinians.
