I. DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Positions in this banded class perform a variety of support tasks in a laboratory, including maintenance, cleaning and sterilization of equipment and the laboratory, maintenance and ordering of inventory, and various record keeping functions. Positions may pickup and deliver equipment, prepare solutions and media, and dispose of contaminated materials from the area. Positions may be responsible for supervision of students.

II. ROLE DESCRIPTIONS BY COMPETENCY LEVEL

Ability to demonstrate an understanding of applicable policies and procedures. Ability to maintain conditions that ensure a healthy and safe working environment.
