I. DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Positions in this banded class perform basic patient care tasks, supportive counseling and a variety of treatments. Direct patient care duties include physical and personal care, assisting patients with activities of daily living, and performing routine treatments, under the close supervision of a Professional Nurse or Physician. Positions may also clean and maintain the patient care environment, perform routine clerical functions, and transport and move patients. Positions may obtain and record pertinent health information, maintain patient data and reports, and provide information to individuals and families.

II. ROLE DESCRIPTIONS BY COMPETENCY LEVEL

Positions at this level perform basic patient care tasks, with a large percentage of time spent in the cleaning and maintenance of the work environment, as well as transporting and moving patients. They may schedule appointments and follow-ups, and maintaining appropriate inventory of supplies for treatment areas.	Positions at this level typically spend the majority of time in providing patient care and related treatments, and supportive counseling. Positions at this level assist physicians and other providers with a variety of routine examinations and procedures. They observe the patient while providing routine patient care, and document patient information or significant changes in the patient's condition.	Positions at this level assist physicians and other health care providers with standards nursing assignments, and interpret doctor's orders and diagnoses to patients. They screen patients, documenting vital signs and chief complaints, obtain lab specimens per protocol, and manage patient/office appointments. They perform a variety of clerical and nursing tasks, recording and maintaining patient data and reports.

IV. COMPETENCY STATEMENTS BY LEVEL

Knowledge – Technical

Knowledge of basic nursing techniques and procedures in the routine care and treatment of patients. Knowledge of medical procedures and terminology. Ability to provide personal care for patients.

Full knowledge - The broad scope of knowledge demonstrated on the job that is beyond journey competencies.

Client Customer Service

Ability to develop and maintain professional relationships with patients, their families and staff by listening, understanding and responding to identified needs.

Communication

V. MINIMUM TRAINING & EXPERIENCE

Demonstrated possession of the competencies necessary to perform the work. Some positions may require registration as a Nurse Aide by the North Carolina Board of Nursing or certification through the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA.)
